

Seven Bricks to Lay the Foundation for Difficult Dialogue

- 1. Intentionally structure hot topics into your lesson plan.
- 2. Connect the hot topics to the learning objectives or course outcomes at the beginning of class.
- 3. Build a trusting classroom climate.
- 4. Include a statement about conduct expectations in the syllabus or learning agreement.
- 5. Collaborate with the class to create dialogue "rules of engagement".
- 6. Help students develop productive conversation skills as part of learning.
- 7. Start practicing your rules of engagement and conversation skill building early in the course with less divisive conversations.
